#### 'Blitz' cleaning Norbury

Croydon Council kick-starts a series of 'blitz' clean-ups, starting with Norbury High Street, aiming to rejuvenate our district and town centres to bring back a sense of pride in our borough.

- Fly-Tipping Solutions: Using data-driven insights, we're tackling fly-tipping hotspots in public spaces. We're also collaborating with landowners to ensure private areas are free of fly-tipping.
- Graffiti and Fly-Posting Clean-up: Small businesses receive their first clean free of charge, along with tips to prevent vandalism. We're erasing graffiti and fly-posting to create a cleaner ambiance.
- Pavements are receiving a mechanical wash, refreshed appearance
- Leaves and debris that lead to flooding are being cleared in gulleys We're partnering with Transport for London (TfL) and Network Rail for a coordinated approach. But it doesn't end here:
- · Residents and businesses involved to maintain the area's cleanliness
- Love Clean Streets app empowers everyone to report issues like fly-tipping, overflowing bins, and graffiti from their smart phones.

Norbury is the first of many high streets prioritized for clean-up using insights from the Love Clean Streets app.

Jason Perry, Executive Mayor of Croydon, shares his vision: "Clean streets improve quality of life for all. Safety, attractiveness, and thriving businesses are the rewards. Let's unite for Croydon's best look!"

#### **ULEZ** is Here

August 29, 2023, the ultra-low emission zone extended to cover our homes in Norbury and the surrounding region: https://tfl.gov.uk/modes/driving/ultra-low-emission-zone/ulez-expansion-2023

Non-compliant vehicles driving in the zone face a daily tax of £12.50. Avoid penalties and potential high costs by checking your vehicle's compliance: https://www.tfl.gov.uk/modes/driving/check-your-vehicle/ Act swiftly to access grants provided by the Mayor of London on a first-come, first-served basis for vehicle replacement.

#### Revving Up Awareness on Speeding

Promoting road safety and curbing speeding is a top concern for the PHRA and its members.

On August 18, 2023, our members collaborated with local Police SNT for Speed Awareness monitoring on the hill. This proactive initiative highlights our dedication to a secure environment. Through such activities, we aim to raise awareness, deter speeding, and ensure adherence to speed limits.

Our partnership with law enforcement reflects our goal of a safer neighbourhood for all.





#### Community Vigilance and Safety around Vehicle Theft

A surge in vehicle thefts, both attempted and successful, demands heightened vigilance from our community. PHRA urges neighbours to lock their vehicles securely. For those with key-less start cars, safeguard your keys away from your front door, as criminals employ advanced methods to clone keys wirelessly.

If you spot suspicious individuals near your vehicle, promptly report to the Police, if non-emergency then dial 111. Additionally, share any suspicious activity captured by security cameras, yours or your neighbours', with the police to aid their investigations.

Let's unite to protect our neighbourhood against these threats.

#### **Norbury Library Updates**

Norbury has been chosen as a pilot library for the new Open+ Self Service scheme. This means that from October 2nd the library will be available five days during the week (instead of the current three).

10am - 6pm and from 9am - 5pm on Saturdays! Tuesday, Thursday and Friday will continue to be fully staffed with all services available.

Residents can Register for Open+ by upgrading their library cards (at the library) and getting a PIN number for accessing the building on the new days. There will be a Council employee staffing the building, all book borrowing and returns will be electronic and the photocopier will be unavailable. Access to toilets will be on request of the staff member. 16-17 year olds will need a parent / guardian to sign their registration and 16 and under will need to be accompanied by an adult registered to the Self Service Opening. The Study Area and computers will be available.

#### Mayor's Question Time

The meeting was chaired by the Deputy Mayor Lynne Hale with a welcome and opening remarks around the agenda and general housekeeping protocol, as standard.

There were cabinet members and councillors in the audience of around 60, Love Norbury members and resident association representatives were in attendance, meaning plenty of opportunities to unpack the evening and feedback through local channels.

Mayor Jason Perry's opening remarks were not lacking in detail. 16 months in office has been quite a journey, in May 2022 inherited a broken council with 1.6bn of debt and costs 66 million a year to service with assets of 300k and a controllable budget of 330k. 161 legacy issues were identified and 49 of which are still ongoing as a result of the opening of the books programme. The wind up of the council's failed developer brick by brick and the untangling of the council's failing companies, is still ongoing. Despite the difficulties there have been some successes: on planning, SPD2 planning document fully revoked (details of spd2 available on our website) and the local plan currently under review, regeneration of the town centre with regular meetings with the owners of Westfield and the expectation that new plans will filter through the council.

Norbury was the first of many planned Blitz clean borough-wide programmes (details we have already posted to our website!). New mechanical sweepers have been trialled and as a result of the blitz, reports of fly-tips have dropped significantly.

A notable mention here is a plan to remove the graffiti from the rail bridge and this will include the London Road needing to be temporarily closed to facilitate. This will be a welcomed improvement to the visual amenity of the Norbury district centre. The street Bins have also been restored along the London Road! A special thanks must go to Tony and the team from litter free Norbury for their unrelenting efforts to get our bins back in Norbury and to councillor Scott Roche for making this happen.



Crime and policing were mentioned but this mostly relates to the lapsed PSPO's being reinstated with Thornton Heath getting prioritised after the town centre. Public Space Protection Orders give Police greater powers from the council to deal with for example, Street drinkers.

Housing was mentioned with the infamous Regina Road scandal and the transformation plan that is in progress. A residents' charter has been adopted which resets the relationship with the council and ensures council tenants are treated with respect.

Finally, Mayor Perry ended on holding to account those that brought the borough to its knees with the Penn report and Kroll report passed to the Police. Final word much more to do, the journey of improvement is well underway and he and his team are determined to restore pride in our borough.

For the purpose of keeping this article short two questions have been selected from the Q&A session; When is the library opening on Saturday and the function room being more readily accessible to the community. Mayor Perry mentioned that open plus will be coming which will allow the use of the library on Saturday as part of a phased approach however the function room access will still be limited access until the costs to the council can be worked through. When are the Bus Shelters being reinstated? The bus shelters are a legacy issue and should have been installed 18 months ago. The contractor (Valo) is obliged to install them and the Mayor has reminded them of their obligation. We should see Bus shelters coming before the end of the year however the contract could be terminated, if not.

#### The top three priorities set for SNT as voted by the ward members:

#### **Violence Related Priority**

More specifically against a person. This was expanded to include Violence Against Women and Girls (VAWG), with walk in sessions being offered for those affected to speak to a female officer specifically. Aims are to pro-actively patrol Norbury & Pollards Hill Ward to reduce violence within the Ward. Patrol known hot spot areas that are cause for concern on our Ward.

#### Theft of and Theft From Motor Vehicle

Vehicle related crime is a priority in this ward and also in neighbour wards. SNT Norbury & Pollards Hill is engaging proactive patrol and delivering valuable advise towards target hardening in relation to theft offences.

#### Drug Offences, Possession and Possession with Intent to Supply

We are conducting patrol to gather intelligence related to drugs user and suppliers, we are actively looking to apply warrants to put a stop towards PWITS and active patrols on the prevention of any drug use.

#### **Speeding**

This one is caveat as SNT may need to use their connections with the Traffic unit.


